PARTNERING FOR COMMUNITY OUTREACH

At a local church level, we have a vision to reach the lost in our community. However, we acknowledge that this can be hard work and at times we can feel isolated and alone. In this workshop we will learn from like-minded churches how we can work together, along with Christian camps to strengthen, deepen and potentially accelerate the church community outreach and help fulfil Christ's mission.

THE UPSIDE-DOWN KINGDOM

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In Mark 10:35-45, Jesus challenges the conventional power structures by emphasising the virtues of humility and servant leadership. The implications of this Upside-Down Kingdom are particularly profound in the context of cross-cultural mission where instead of approaching missions with a top-down mindset, the Upside-Down Kingdom calls for a humility that seeks to understand, serve, and learn from diverse communities. It challenges us to embody the selfless love and sacrificial service exemplified by Jesus, fostering a collaborative approach that recognises the dignity and worth of every individual across cultural boundaries.

GETTING PRACTICAL WITH PRAYER PRACTICES IN MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP

Rooted in passages such as Luke 4:18-19, where Jesus declares His mission to bring good news to the poor, this concept shapes our cross-cultural mission endeavours. It underscores the call to address systemic inequalities and uplift marginalised communities, reflecting God's concern for the oppressed and economically disenfranchised. The implications of this extends beyond charity; they prompt a transformative engagement that seeks to empower and dignify, echoing the biblical mandate to love one's neighbour as oneself.

LEADING AS A CO-JOURNEYER
